

## COMMISSIONERS INDEPENDENT SCRUTINY REPORT Stop Search Scrutiny Review February 2023

Scrutiny Panel:	STOP AND SEARCH
Scrutiny Group:	Julie O'Connor Mat Round Mohamed Parekh Andy Cowan Geraint Lang
Purpose:	The Panel are to check that Stop and Search procedure has been followed and that Body Worn Videos reviewed are compliant with the law and are being used effectively. The panel will focus on:  • Whether Body Worn Video Policy was adhered to, • Whether the principles of GO WISELY were followed, • Whether the principles of JOG were followed.  Note: GO WISELY & JOG Principles available in Appendix 1.
Panel Findings:	The time period selected for the Stop and Search incidents was 1st December 2022 to 31st December 2022. During this period 322 Stop and Search incidents took place.  10 Incidents were selected randomly by the panel. Of the 10 incidents selected Body Worn Video could not be found for 2 incidents. Further investigations were made and it was identified that the officers concerned had not tagged the video as Stop and Search and the video footage had been deleted after 31 days. These officers have been advised by their supervisors of the need to ensure that Stop and Search footage is tagged correctly.  Of the remaining 7 incidents 3 were vehicle searches. Two of these searches did not involve personal interaction and were dismissed. 5 searches were selected to be observed in the scrutiny meeting.  Incident matrix & findings available in Appendix 2.  Officers from the OPST team gave an overview of the training given to officers when undertaking Stop Searches and when to use handcuffs etc. The decision to handcuff would be determined by the risk assessment by the officers, the location of the stop, the demeanour of the detainee, previous intelligence provided or to prevent disposal of evidence.  No areas of concern were identified. The officers who carried out the searches did so with professionalism and respect to detainees.



	The panel thanked Chief Inspector Barlow for his comprehensive explanation of each incident and to James Felix and David Wall from OPST team for their clarification and knowledge on use of handcuffs in a Stop Search scenario.
Recommendations:	To identify person searches only for future scrutiny review.
