Progress on Reviews since last ETAP meeting	At the last meeting we reported on our Review of the Commissioner's Independent Scrutiny Panels (CISP) Project: We reviewed the SCO CISP project, examining the process used to transition from a structure based on Safer Neighbourhood Panels to the establishment of the Commissioner's Independent Scrutiny Panels. We made a small number of comments on use of project management tools. Overall, we found that the process was well-managed and completed in a timely fashion.	The first stage of this review was completed by the end of March. A second stage is now underway and we are examining the operation of the three CISP from I April 2022 to 31 July 2023. Each Panel covers one area of policing practice: • Stop Search • Use of Force • Custody & Detention. This is an important area because effective independent local scrutiny should support the building of public confidence in our local police service.
Planned reviews	At our September meeting we had a verbal update on the Force's response to the HMICFRS Inspection in November 2022 which focused on vetting – an area of considerable public interest and concern across all forces.	We had a thorough briefing from Jonathon Gupta on this as well as other national changes in relation to vetting and wider issues in relation to professional standards. We will be having a detailed discussion on the most appropriate focus for a Review in the coming months.
