This is an important area because effective independent local scrutiny should support the building of public confidence in our local police service. We had access to all relevant documentation and meetings with the SCO Director of Governance and Assurance Officer gave us a good level of detailed understanding. The final review report went to Strategic Governance Board and was published on the SCO website in December. We had good assurance that the Panels are operating effectively, with an active and diverse membership and that the Force is actively engaged and positively welcomes the scrutiny and input from the Panels.
