Freedom of Information request: reference SCO/FOI/09/2021, first notified to us by email on the 4 February 2021.

Staffordshire Commissioner's Office response to your enquiry is as follows:

I can confirm that the Staffordshire Commissioner's Office does hold the requested information.

What were the results of the recent public consultation on increasing the council tax precept, I note that the increase seems to have been rubber stamped (again), I would like to know how many people replied and how many agreed/disagreed with an increase.

The resident's survey/public consultation generated 2,258 responses. 22% of individuals favoured a freeze in council tax, 21% favoured a proposal of a 4.99% increase with 57% favouring the maximum increase in precept.

This information can also be found in the Police and Crime Budget report for 2021/22 which, was presented to the Police, Fire and Crime Panel on the 1st February 2021 and I have documented the link below.
